Welcome to the 63rd United States Women's Open Championship.

The United States Golf Association is conducting the 2008 Championship at the beautiful and historic Interlachen Country Club.

Interlachen boasts towering trees and is one of the most scenic courses in the Midwest. It was originally designed by William Watson, a noted Scottish golf architect, and opened in 1911. The famed Donald Ross, who also laid out Minikahda Country Club in Minneapolis, was brought in to completely revise the course. Ross's renovation was completed in 1919. Robert Trent Jones later revised the first and third holes. American golf architect Garrett Gill has added modern touches to the famed layout but the course remains a Donald Ross design.

Interlachen has been the scene of many of golf's most treasured moments. In 1914, Jim Barnes won the Western Open here. The 1930 U.S. Open victory by Robert T. Jones, Jr. stands out as it was one of his four major championship victories in the Grand Slam. In 1935, Interlachen's own Patty Berg, the incomparable personality and champion, kicked off her career with a runner-up finish to Glenna Collett Vare in the U.S. Women's Amateur at Interlachen. The course was also the setting for the 1986 USGA Senior Amateur and the 1993 Walker Cup Match.

We are confident that Interlachen will once again identify a worthy champion.

Every effort has been made to provide convenient access to and from the course, as well as to secure the best viewing opportunities for spectators. This easy-to-read guide contains suggestions we hope will make your experience more enjoyable.

We hope your memories of this national championship will be lasting ones—memories of a wonderful golf course, thrilling competition at the very highest level and most importantly, a renewed affection for the unique spirit of integrity and sportsmanship that makes golf the greatest game of all.

The United States Golf Association (USGA) has served as the national governing body of golf since its formation in 1894. It is a non-profit organization run by golfers for the benefit of golfers. The USGA remains committed to promoting policies and programs in the best interests of the game.

More than 9,500 private and public golf courses, clubs and facilities make up the USGA. An Executive Committee of 15 volunteers oversees the Association with more than 1,300 volunteers from all parts of the country serving on various USGA committees. A professional staff of approximately 300 directs the Association's day-to-day functions from Golf House, the USGA's headquarters in Far Hills, New Jersey.

U.S. WOMEN'S OPEN CHAMPIONSHIP HISTORY

The United States Women's Open was added to the USGA roster of championships in 1953, 58 years after the first U.S. Women's Amateur. The reason for the USGA's relatively late assumption of the Women's Open is simple: women's professional golf is relatively new. When she turned professional in 1938, Opal Hill, along with Helen Hicks, were two of the very few women golf professionals in the world.

Unlike the other 12 national championships conducted by the USGA, the Women's Open was created by another organization. In 1946, the short-lived Women's Professional Golfers Association introduced the Women's Open at match play at the Spokane (Wash.) Country Club.

The LPGA conducted the Women's Open from 1949-1952 but in 1953 asked the USGA to conduct the championship. The U.S. Women's Open is the oldest championship open to women professionals and amateurs.

GENERAL INFORMATION

American Express

ATMs

ATMs will be located in the Merchandise Pavilion at the main admission gate and in the Patty Berg Pavilion.

Autographs

A "no autograph" policy is in effect throughout the championship rounds, Thursday – Sunday. Spectators should not approach a player for an autograph from the time immediately preceding the player's starting time up to and including the player's completion of her round, including the time when the player is at the practice range and practice green or en route to her first tee.

Camera Policy

Cameras and camcorders are only allowed on site at the course during practice rounds, Monday through Wednesday, for personal photographic use only and without their cases.

Catch the Spirit

Visit the USGA Catch the Spirit Junior Tent located near the main admission gate to the right of the 17th hole. As part of the "Catch the Spirit" program, kids ages 17 and younger are guaranteed an up-close-and-personal look at the players. Juniors will receive:

- Free admission to the championship when accompanied by a ticketed adult
- Front-row seating at all on-course grandstands, Monday through Sunday
- A chance to hone skills and have fun on a putting green set up just for juniors
- The opportunity to participate in a golf course scavenger hunt
- Tours of the golf course
- Free lunch voucher
- Free "Catch the Spirit" ball cap

Disabled Spectators

The USGA is pleased to provide the following services to our spectators with disabilities:

- Accessible parking spaces will be available at the Southdale Center championship parking lot.
- Wheelchair accessible vehicles will be available to transport spectators with disabilities to and from the course.
- The Disabled Services Committee will be on site to transport spectators to and from the main admission gate and designated viewing areas around the course.
- Motorized scooters will be available at the main admission gate for spectators with disabilities, on a first-come, first-served basis, compliments of the USGA and Pride Mobility.
- Accessible restroom facilities will be available at port-a-let locations throughout the course.

First Aid Stations

First Aid stations will be located at the main admission gate and the clubhouse. All First Aid stations will be staffed with licensed medical personnel. If a medical emergency arises, please notify a U.S. Women's Open volunteer or USGA official.

Food and Beverage Service

There will be eight concession-stand locations on the course that will have food and beverages for purchase.



Grandstands

Grandstands will be located at strategic viewing areas. Seating is provided on a first-come, first-served basis. The front row of all grandstands is reserved for kids, ages 17 and younger.

Kids Get In Free – Catch the Spirit Program

Kids 17 and younger will be admitted free of charge, on any day, when accompanied by a ticketed adult. Additionally, each child will receive a voucher for a free lunch, goodie bag, and front-row seating at all grandstands. Lunch vouchers and goodie bags are available in the USGA Catch the Spirit Tent.

Sample menu items include scrambled eggs, bacon and fresh fruit in the morning and Philly cheese steak, grilled chicken and fish sandwiches in the afternoon. Coffee, soda, beer, wine and mixed drinks are available. Acceptable forms of payment are: U.S. dollars, travelers checks, American Express, Discover, MasterCard and Visa. Upscale, air-conditioned restrooms are conveniently located adjacent to the tent.

Merchandise Pavilion

The Merchandise Pavilion, with more than 10,000 square feet of space, will be located at the main admission gate to the right of the 17th hole. A variety of merchandise bearing the U.S. Women's Open logo will be offered. Available merchandise includes caps, shirts, T-shirts, sweaters, jackets, lanyards, artwork, lapel pins, golf balls, ball mark repair tools, ball markers, towels and much more.

Acceptable forms of payment are: U.S. dollars, American Express, Discover, MasterCard, Visa and debit cards. Personal checks are not accepted.

The Merchandise Pavilion is open throughout the entire week of the championship.

Since the Merchandise Pavilion is located on the championship grounds, you must have a U.S. Women's Open ticket or credential to gain entry to the Merchandise Pavilion during championship week.

Restroom Facilities

Security

We appreciate your patience and cooperation with all of the U.S. Women's Open security procedures.

Spectators, volunteers and staff will not be allowed on the shuttle buses or through an Admission Gate with any of the items listed below. Please be sure to read the following list of prohibited items carefully:

No Pets (other than service animals)

No Lawn and/or Folding Armchairs

No Bicycles

No Ladders

No Metal-spiked Golf Shoes

No Weapons (regardless of permit, including but not limited to firearms or knives)

No other items deemed unlawful or dangerous by the USGA and/or Championship Security Personnel, in their sole discretion.

Spectator Guidelines

If you observe the following guidelines, your experience at the U.S. Women's Open will be enjoyable:

- Your U.S. Women's Open ticket must be displayed at all times.
- Check daily pairings and tee times available online at www.uswomensopen.com.
- Please stay behind gallery ropes and cooperate with the marshals at all times.

- Please be considerate of others and kneel or sit if you are in the front row of the gallery.
- Drink plenty of fluids to prevent dehydration.
- To ensure your safety at all times, walk carefully and never run.
- The U.S. Women's Open involves substantial walking on grassy hills, dirt paths and other uneven surfaces. Please wear appropriate footwear such as sneakers.

TRANSPORTATION

Interlachen Country Club is located approximately 6 miles northwest of the Southdale Center in Edina, Minn.

Traveling by car

Public parking will be provided free of charge throughout the week in the Southdale corridor in Edina. This area can be accessed off both Hwy 494 and Hwy 62 using France Avenue and Valley View Road.

There is no parking for the U.S. Women's Open at Interlachen Country Club. In addition, parking on streets surrounding Interlachen Country Club is strictly prohibited and violators will be towed immediately.

Directions

The Southdale corridor is located in Edina, Minn., at the corner of West 66th Street and France Avenue South in Hennepin County. The site is bounded by West 66th Street to the north, West 69th Street to the south, York Avenue to the east, and France Avenue to the west. France Avenue is a key north/south artery serving the Minneapolis metropolitan area, while West 66th Street is a major east/west arterial.

ADA Parking

The USGA is pleased to provide the following services to spectators with disabilities:

- Accessible parking spaces will be available at the Southdale Center parking area.
- Wheelchair accessible vehicles will be available to transport spectators with disabilities to and from the course.

TRANSPORTATION ALTERNATIVES

Public Transportation

Metro Transit bus lines #12 and #664 provide walk-in access to the championship. Take these lines to the Methodist Hospital bus stop and follow the sidewalk signs to the main entry of the championship. Schedules for Metro Transit are available at www.metrotransit.org.

Public transportation can also be taken to the Southdale corridor. Once at the Southdale corridor, spectators can ride the championship shuttles free of charge to the U.S. Women's Open. For information about Metro Transit and routes to the Southdale corridor, visit www.metrotransit.org.

Bicycles

Bicycle parking will be located in two locations. Bicycle racks will be located at admission gates located at Interlachen Boulevard and Blake Road and at Interlachen Boulevard and Bywood West. The Greenway Bicycle Trail can be used to access the championship. Riders using this mode of transportation should exit the trail at Excelsior Blvd. and the Depot Coffee House and follow to Blake Road. This stop is located on the east side of Highway 169.

Drop Off Lot

Spectators can be dropped off in the Southdale Center parking area and take a championship shuttle to the course. Signage will direct spectators to this area.

Weather

Average June temperatures range from a high of 80 degrees to a low of 55 degrees. Please remember to wear sun protection: sunscreen, hats and sunglasses.

Weather Warning

The USGA will have meteorology staff on site monitoring the possibility of inclement weather. If inclement weather is approaching, special weather warning signs like the one to the right will be posted on leaderboards around the course. When the sign appears, spectators are advised to take immediate precautions (including clearing grandstands) PRIOR to play being suspended. In the event of a weather warning, please avoid: open areas, hilltops, high places, isolated trees, golf carts and wire fences. If play is suspended, which will be indicated by one prolonged air-horn blast, please close your umbrella and seek shelter. In the event of a suspension of play, grandstands will be cleared immediately.

Will Call

Will Call facilities are conveniently located on site for spectators to drop off and pick up tickets. Will Call will be located at the main admission gate. Photo identification will be required to pick up any tickets left at Will Call. Will Call facilities cannot be accessed by vehicles at anytime.

Ticket/Credential License Agreement

The United States Golf Association (the USGA) has established the following terms and conditions under this Ticket/Credential License Agreement (this Agreement) for the use of Tickets to the 2008 United States Women's Open Championship (the Championship) to be held at Interlachen Country Club, Edina, Minnesota from June 23, 2008 through June 29, 2008 and including any day or days as may be occasioned by a postponement or playoff of any round or rounds. Any individual possessing a valid and legal Ticket and/or Credential shall be deemed a Ticket Holder for the purposes of this Agreement. This Agreement outlines the rights and responsibilities of a Ticket Holder and applies to the sale of all Tickets including sales over the Internet. Additional copies of this Agreement may be obtained by calling (952) 938-8796 or by going to the Championship Web site at www.uswomensopen.com.

Please read this entire Agreement carefully. By accepting a Ticket, a Ticket Holder certifies that he or she has accepted each of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

1. Delivery of Tickets.

(a) Upon receiving any and all Tickets, the Ticket Holder is solely responsible for safeguarding all Tickets. Tickets are valuable and should be treated like currency. Tickets that are lost, stolen, forgotten, mutilated or destroyed will not be replaced. Tickets that are unreadable due to mutilation of any kind will not be accepted for admission.

(b) The Ticket Holder acknowledges and agrees that he or she (i) is responsible for any and all Tickets he or she gives to any third party and (ii) will notify any such third party of the existence and applicability of this Agreement. Any such third party receiving any Ticket or Tickets will be deemed to have accepted each of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

2. Admission.

(a) The Ticket is a revocable license. The Ticket may be revoked without refund or other consideration and the Ticket Holder may be removed from the Championship for (i) failure to comply with any term of the Ticket and/or this Agreement; (ii) failure to obey any posted signs and/or instructions of the Championship marshals and officials and/or (iii) acting in a dangerous or disorderly manner. The license granted by the Ticket may also be terminated by tendering to the Ticket Holder the purchase price of the Ticket. The Ticket Holder has the sole responsibility for complying (or causing any applicable third party to comply) with the Championship Code of Conduct outlined below, as well as all of the terms and conditions contained in this Agreement.

(b) All disputes concerning a Ticket to the Championship and/or the Ticket Holder's rights thereunder and all other disputes and matters whatsoever arising under, in connection with or incident to this Agreement (including but not limited to disputes relating to Ticket orders and attendance by a Ticket Holder at the Championship and all other matters covered by this Agreement) shall be governed by New Jersey law and shall be litigated, if at all, in and before a court of competent jurisdiction located in New Jersey, to the exclusion of the courts of any other county, state or country.

(c) Anyone attempting to alter or reproduce the Ticket in whole or in part will be prosecuted under the law. Resale or attempted resale of the Ticket at a price higher than face value of the Ticket is grounds for seizure or automatic cancellation without refund or other compensation. Ticket sales on or near the grounds associated with the Championship at any price are prohibited. Tickets sold on or near the grounds associated with the Championship are subject to revocation or cancellation without refund or compensation. The Ticket may not be used for or in advertising, promotions (including contests and sweepstakes), or other trade or commercial purposes without the express written consent of the USGA. The Ticket Holder is admitted on the condition that he or she agrees not to transmit or sell or aid in transmitting or selling any description, account, picture or reproduction of the Championship. In addition to all other rights and/or remedies available to the USGA, breach of the foregoing will automatically terminate the Ticket without refund or other compensation.

(d) Each person, regardless of age, must have a Ticket for admission to the Championship.

(e) Dates and times of the Championship are subject to change at any time, either before or during the Championship. The USGA reserves the right, in its sole discretion, to delay, postpone or cancel the Championship for any reason, including weather conditions and safety related issues. There will be no refunds of Tickets as a result of a change in the date or time of the Championship or for any other reason unless a Ticket Holder qualifies for a refund under the Cancellation Policy set forth below.

(f) The USGA is the only authorized seller of Tickets. Tickets obtained from sources other than representatives of the USGA, including but not limited to auction sites, may be lost, stolen or counterfeit and in such cases will not be honored. In addition, Tickets obtained in contravention of the terms of the Ticket and/or this Agreement will not be honored. The USGA has no responsibility for Tickets purchased through an unauthorized source. Ticket Holders in possession of Tickets that have been reported as lost or stolen are subject to removal from the Championship and may be referred to local authorities for investigation.

3. Accessibility to Persons with Disabilities.

The USGA does not discriminate on the basis of disability and will, subject to availability, make accommodations for ticketed individuals with disabilities.

4. Postponement and Cancellation Policy.

- (a) Ticket Holder acknowledges and agrees that (i) any and all decisions relating to a cancellation and/or postponement of the Championship shall be made by the USGA, in its sole discretion, and (ii) Ticket Holder shall adhere to such decisions in connection with its obligations under this Agreement.
- (b) There will be no on-site refunds for the cancelled Championship. Refunds, if available, will be made by the USGA only to the Ticket Holder.

5. Championship Code of Conduct.

(a) The following is a list of disallowed and restricted items and activities within the Championship: cell phones (including cell phones with photographic capabilities), PDAs and/or other Portable E-mail Devices, noise-producing electronic devices, cameras and/or camcorders (other than Monday through Wednesday for personal non commercial photographic use only and without their cases), bags larger than 8" x 8" x 8" in their natural state, cases and/or covers (such as chair or umbrella covers), signs, posters and/or banners, televisions and radios, food and/or beverages, containers and/or coolers, pets (other than service animals), lawn and/or folding armchairs, bicycles, ladders, metal-spiked golf shoes, weapons (regardless of permit, but not limited to firearms or knives) and/or any other items deemed unlawful or dangerous by the USGA and/or Championship Security Personnel, in their sole discretion.

(b) For security or other purposes consistent with the license granted by the Ticket, the Ticket Holder consents to the reasonable inspection of his/her person and property before entering and/or during the Championship. The USGA reserves the right to refuse admission to the Championship or eject any person refusing such procedures or where a search produces contents or items deemed unlawful, dangerous or prohibited by the USGA, in its sole discretion. Disallowed or improperly used permitted items will be confiscated. Permitted items left unattended will be removed by security personnel for future pick-up. The USGA is not obligated to hold any item for a period of time longer than the end of play on the day the item was confiscated by the USGA, nor is the USGA liable for the value of any confiscated and/or unattended item. 6. Disclaimer and Limitation of Liability and Scope of this Agreement.

It is further understood and agreed that this waiver, release and assumption of risk is binding on the Ticket Holder's heirs and assigns.

(b) Tickets to the Championship are sold by the USGA on an AS IS basis without warranties or representations of any kind, either express or implied, other than those warranties that are implied by and incapable of exclusion, restriction or modification under New Jersey law. IN NO EVENT WILL THE USGA OR ANY OTHER PERSON INVOLVED IN ANY WAY WITH THE USGA'S TICKETING PROGRAM BE LIABLE FOR ANY DAMAGES, INCLUDING WITHOUT LIMITATION, DIRECT, INDIRECT, INCIDENTAL, SPECIAL, CONSEQUENTIAL OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES, OR FOR LOST PROFITS, CLAIMED BY ANY TICKET HOLDER IN CONNECTION WITH ANY OF THE MATTERS COVERED BY THIS AGREEMENT, whether for breach of contract, tortious behavior, negligence, or any other cause of action, other than the exclusive remedies expressly outlined in this Agreement.

(c) This Agreement together with the Ticket contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the matters outlined in this Agreement, and supersedes all previous written or oral agreements or understandings between the parties with respect to such subject matter.
